This superordinate perspective & competence is missing in existing organizational forms of case management (CsM) (e.g. discharge management, CsM mobile care providers) in order to keep the balance between humanity and economics. The aim of the CaRe project is the development, regional piloting and evaluation of a superordinate crossinstitutional CrM office, which serves as a regional contact point & counseling center for the system & care management of elderly people in need of care and their caring relatives. The benefit is demonstrated in the relief to hospitals, outpatient providers, the public sector and funding agencies through the creation of an innovative CrM office that provides sustainable management & coordination of care quality & cost-efficiency. This leads to a regional change in the program area. The model of intervention envisaged by ECARE is based on the involvement of the community (neighbors, friends, relatives) and on the creation of new relationships and common interests. The participants will be accompanied on a path of improving their lifestyle starting from an assessment carried out by professionals on the risk to which they are exposed in areas relevant to their social relationships and their health, particularly nutrition, physical activity, cognitive and sensory stimulation.
