Most European countries are facing the same challenge in the increasing elderly population. This is true for all ageing people, also for people with disabilities. Through study visits and European projects, the working groups ENSA Elderly and Disability exchange experiences and knowledge from research and best practice in these fields:

- *active healthy ageing;*
- *housing;*
- *nutrition – pleasurable meals;*
- *new innovative technologies for the elderly / disabled.*
- *fall and injury prevention*
- *people with learning disabilities;*
- *supported employment and work in the open labour market;*
- *leisure and daily activities;*
- *education and sports;*
- *accessibility: Improving the design of accessible spaces for persons with disabilities regardless of their disability (physical, sensory, mental, cognitive or mental);*
- *participation: allowing equal participation of disabled people in public and political life.*

Furthermore, mental health plays a very important role in order. That is also true for elderly persons and persons with disabilities. A good mental health enables them to improve overall wellbeing, to maintain healthy relationships with others, and appreciate life and to have a better quality of life allowing independent living and to combat the isolation and loneliness.

*ENSA thematic working group elderly and disability meeting, taking place on July 1st in Val-de-Marne, jointly organized with the final conference of the European funded project ABOVE (Abilities On the move) on July 2nd, will be occasion to gather researchers, professionals, decision-makers and persons with mental health disabilities around the topic of **Elderly persons, persons with disabilities and Mental health: challenges and solutions?**. This two day's gathering will be an opportunity for European partners to exchange about this topic and to build concrete common European projects for 2019/2020. On July 2nd through the final conference of the European funded project ABOVE, organized by Departmental Council of Val-de-Marne (Department of Autonomy), many stakeholders from France and Europe will discuss the issue of Mental health and social and professional inclusion of persons with mental health disabilities.*
